Australian Year 12 programs

(Australia and offshore)

- > Apply through the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC) satac.edu.au/undergraduate
- > Entry is determined by a Selection Rank score, which is your Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR), including any Adjustment Factors
- > Adjustment Factors are automatically processed by SATAC and based on any eligible subjects you passed in Year 12
- > You can apply for up to six degrees
- > Applications open in August and close early December (however you can still apply through SATAC until early January)
- > The first offer round is in December (shortly after Year 12 results are released) with further offer rounds in January
- > You will also receive an offer from the University, and you will need to respond to the University offer as soon as possible to secure your place in your offered

UniSA GUARANTEED ENTRY

> Through UniSA Guaranteed Entry, you will automatically receive an offer if you meet the set Selection Rank. You can also get guaranteed entry based on your three best Year 12 subject grades for most degrees. If you achieve the selection grades, along with any prerequisities, and put UniSA as your first preference, you are automatically in.


